



A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR CAT RAMIREZ

What does it mean to be at home with yourself? Throughout this artistic process and the past two years, I've asked myself this question. Since 2020, everyone I know has reckoned with a personal homecoming in one way or another, and *Today Is My Birthday* is a play about that reckoning. It delves into the after-effects of having your life turned inside out. The play's grief, isolation, and longing are told through a lens that feels all-too-familiar in its contradictions. Time simultaneously moves with the blink of an eye and in slow motion. Space roots firmly in reality while also tumbling into projected worlds. Characters reach out for community with one hand and push them away with the other. They stumble, say things they don't mean, and struggle to identify and ask for what they need.

When I think about the times that I've felt most fiercely independent and grounded in myself, those are the times I have felt most connected to the people around me. It is impossible to be at home with yourself without knowing and valuing your beloved community. In March 2020, a show I was working on and deeply tied to was indefinitely postponed a few blocks from this theater. It feels apt to return to directing in-person theatre in Philly with *Today is My Birthday*. I can't think of a more fitting cast and creative team to work with. Amongst these incredible artists are longtime collaborators, art crushes, and mentors, and I'm honored to create this story with them.

Theatre Exile is dedicated to enhancing the cultural experiences of Philadelphians through the staging of works that engage the imagination. Founded in 1996 by Joe Canuso and Trish Kelly, Theatre Exile was created by a group of artists that explore the complexities of the human condition packed with Philadelphian grit and passion. Exile is the first Philadelphia organization to produce such powerhouse playwrights as Tracy Letts, Lucas Hnath, Annie Baker, Rajiv Joseph, Rona Munro, and Hansol Jung among others. In 2016, Exile was named most fearless theatre by Philly Currents and Best Theatre Company by Philadelphia Magazine. Exile received 92 Barrymore nominations, with 19 awards. In 2017, Theatre Exile left their home to begin a new phase in Exile's life. Following her idea to create a new home in their old location in South Philadelphia, Deborah Block with the Board of Directors collaborated with Center City Development and Cecil Baker + Partners, and created a vision for a new theatre that honors the art and maintains Exile's goals of working in an intimate and flexible environment. They produced their first play in the new theatre in February 2019 and moved their office to the new space in April 2019.
