

A NOTE FROM PRODUCING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR DEBORAH BLOCK

Welcome back into Exile.

All of us in Exile are thrilled to be producing the Philadelphia premiere of *The Motherf**ker with the Hat* by Stephen Adly Guirgis directed by Ozzie Jones. Since it premiered in 2011, this play has been discussed almost annually as a potential play in our season. For one reason or another we weren't able to make it happen. Finally, the planets aligned. With Ozzie at the helm we assembled a stellar cast and an excellent design team. We're so proud to bring this awardwinning play by the Pulitzer Prize winning playwright to Philadelphia audiences as the center of our 25th Anniversary season.

It is a landmark play – a script steeped in Theatre Exile's mission of producing shows filled with raw humor and Philly grit. The play follows Jackie, as he struggles to stay clean after being recently released from two years in prison. The story illuminates the many complicated faces of love and friendship while showing us the erupting drama that surrounds those navigating the struggles of sobriety. One of the many things that makes this play so compelling to me is that it's not about using drugs, it's about living – specifically trying to get your life back and the many human obstacles that often get in the way. It shows how easy it is to replace the rush of drugs with human drama – both the kind that naturally exists and the kind that we create.

The play is even more relevant today than when it premiered, as the drug epidemic has continued to plague communities of all backgrounds. While the script is placed in NYC, Ozzie saw an opportunity to shed light on the ongoing opioid crisis in Philadelphia's Kensington neighborhood. He is a big believer in how theater should address the reality of what's happening in the world. The concept for the show that Ozzie envisioned was inspired by a common experience among addicts who often relive their past traumas and the cycle of self-sabotage that they perpetuate.

The diorama of photographs that you see on the set, depict the hardships in Kensington and Center City and represents the internal struggle that Jackie and the other characters face on a daily basis.

We're honored that an incredible team faced so many obstacles around COVID safety in order to come together to bring this show to this stage. And thank you for doing the same.

Thank you for coming to live theater.

Thank you for joining us in Exile.

They include: the extended, sold-out run of The Last Days of Judas Iscariot, our Lady of 121st Street (named one of the ten best plays of 2003; Lucille Lortel, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle Best Play Nominations), Jesus Hopped the A Train (Edinburgh Fringe First Award, Olivier Nomination as London's Best New Play, Barrymore Award, "Detroit Free Press" Best Play Award), and In Arabia, We'd All Be Kings (Ten Best of '99, "TimeOut New York," critics pick, "TimeOut London"). All four plays were originally produced by LAByrinth, directed by Philip Seymour Hoffman, and are published through Dramatists Play Service and by Faber & Faber. Stephen was awarded a 2004 TCG fellowship, attended the 2004 Sundance Screenwriters Lab, was named one of the 25 New Faces of Independent Film by "Filmmaker Magazine," and appeared in "Entertainment Weekly's" 2005 Summer Must List. He has received new play commissions from Manhattan Theater Club and South Coast Rep. is a member of New Dramatists and the MCC Playwright's Coalition, and has contributed to "ESOPUS" magazine. Television writing credits include NYPD Blue, The Sopranos, David Milch's CBS drama Big Apple, and Shane Salerno's NBC drama UC: Undercover. As an actor, he has appeared in Brett C. Leonard's GUINEA PIG SOLO, produced at the Public Theater in New York, and played leading roles



Ozzie Jones (Director) has a long history creating, performing, and teaching theater and is an accomplished musician and producer. A brief overview of his theater works includes Assistant Artistic Director to Walter Dallas at Freedom Theater, a member of the first Lincoln Center Theater Director's Lab, director and performer in the Crossroads Theater Genesis Festival, Co-Artistic Director of Venture Theater, Producing Artistic Director of the Walt Whitman Arts

Center and a member of the Philadelphia Theater Initiative where he represented Philadelphia Theater in the United States and Europe. Collaborators include Ntozake Shange, Spike Lee, Jill Scott, Rennie Harris Pure Movement, Kimmika Williams -Witherspoon, Larry "Mr. Cisum" Fowler Jr., Roni Graham, and Harriet Powers. Accolades include the Hal Prince Best Director of a Musical Barrymore Award for Black Nativity, the 7Arts Magazine Award for 50 of Philadelphia's Rising Stars, and a finalist for the Haas Award for an emerging artist. When he became the first African American to direct a play in Ireland for an Irish Theater company, The Irish Times called his work "the most creative and innovative production of Shakespeare" seen in Ireland in decades." Mr. Jones started and founded the acting studio Rhythm One in the CEC, where he currently teaches actors of all ages and skillsets acting, writing, and performance techniques. It was there that he worked with the incubation of what would become Theater in The X founded by Carlo Campbell, Walt DeShields, and LaNeshe Miller-White. Some recent directing credits include: *Hype Man* (Interact Theater Company), *My Father's Daughter* by Ursula Rucker (Freedom Theater), and the Painted Bride in Philadelphia and La MaMa in New York, and Othello 2015 (Theater in the X.) Mr. Jones has just completed writing a road gang and cotton field hollers opera called, Gwine Dig a Hole. Currently, Mr. Jones is developing a large series of plays on Jazz called *The Real Book*.

Matthew Kiesling (Assistant Director) is a director, actor, singer, writer, and improviser. Recently he acted in the upcoming indie horror film *Acolyte*. He is a graduate of NYU Tisch Drama New Studio on Broadway and the Upright Citizens Brigade. Melissa Dunphy (Composer & Sound Designer) specializes in vocal, political, and theatrical music. She first came to national attention when Rachel Maddow described her large-scale work the *Gonzales Cantata* as "the coolest thing you've ever seen on this show." Recent commissions include works for VOCES8, Cantus, the Museum of the American Revolution, and the Mendelssohn Chorus; currently, she is working on an opera for Oberlin Conservatory for which she received a 2020 Opera America Discovery Grant. 

Deborah has been with Theatre Exile since 2006 and assumed the position of Producing Artistic Director in 2013. Prior to that she was one of the founding organizers of the Philadelphia Live Arts Festival and Philly Fringe (now FringeArts) and was the program director for ten years. She received her MFA at Temple University where she taught for nine years. She has sat on many local and national panels. For Theatre Exile she has directed Extreme Home Makeover, Babel, Among the Dead, Sing the Body Electric, Guards at the Taj, Smoke, Red Speedo, Cock, The English Bride, Gruesome Playground Injuries, Iron, Hunter Gatherers, dark play or stories for boys, Roosters and collaborated on Hearts & Soles.

Theatre Exile is celebrating its 25th anniversary season. Since it was first founded in 1996 by Joe Canuso and Trish Kelly, Theatre Exile has been dedicated to enhancing the cultural experiences of Philadelphians through the staging of works that engage the imagination. In July, 2013 Deborah Block assumed the role of Producing Artistic Director. Under her leadership Exile continues to produce plays that explore the complexities of the human condition packed with Philadelphia grit and passion. Exile is the first Philadelphia organization to produce such powerhouse playwrights as Tracy Letts, Lucas Hnath, Annie Baker, Rajiv Joseph, Rona Munro, and Hansol Jung among others. In 2016 Exile was named most fearless theatre by Philly Currents and Best Theater Company by Philadelphia Magazine. Exile received the Time Out Recommended Award 2017. For excellence in producing theatre, Exile has received 92 Barrymore nominations, with 19 awards. In 2017 Theatre Exile left their home to begin a new phase in Exile's life. Following her idea to create a new home in their old location in South Philadelphia, Deborah with the Board of Directors collaborated with Center City Development and Cecil Baker + Partners, and created a vision for a new theater that honors the art and maintains Exile's goals of working in an intimate and flexible environment. They produced their first play in the new theater in February 2019 and moved their office to the new space in April 2019. We are proud that we have kept our team together and producing work throughout the pandemic. As Theatre Exile looks towards the future, all of us in Exile are excited that our 25th Anniversary season will be our first full season in our new home.
