

# A NOTE FROM PRODUCING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR DEBORAH BLOCK



Back in March - almost a year ago, when everything abruptly shut down, we were already in the process of figuring out what the next season would look like. With so much uncertainty we decided to focus on what we do best; producing engaging scripts that focus on the human journey embedded in contemporary issues. Our shows are intimate, raw, provocative and truthful.

Sin Eaters by Anna Moench called to us. We knew that whether it was in the theater or on a screen, we found the right script for us. Mary Lee and Derek, the two main characters in the play, are in a long-term loving

relationship in which they are struggling to find financial security. Mary Lee is thrilled to find a job in "tech." But that choice causes a series of events that shakes Mary and their relationship to the core.

Mary Lee's job, content management for a large social media platform, is shrouded in mystery. As in the case in the real world, content moderators are often highly controlled and isolated without proper support services they need in order to navigate the deep amount of visual assault that they "eat" daily. Employees often display PTSD-like symptoms as a result of the job. They even have to sign non-disclosure agreements that prevent them from getting support from their family and friends.

This job, and others like it expose a troubling characteristic of a workplace ethos entrenched in the United States. Unfortunately jobs like content moderators are necessary in order to keep the internet safe for the rest of us. We've long known that the anonymity of the internet doesn't always nurture the best of humanity. But undervaluing and silencing those who are doing the dirty work behind the scenes in this and any industry is not the path to creating a healthy workplace. Our society still has not figured out the economics of humanity.

*Sin Eaters* does not follow a political agenda, but rather allows us to follow a young woman simply trying to find some stability and make a better life for her and her partner.

At the beginning of our season I shared with our audiences that I hope to tell stories that help us understand our human journey better. Thank you for joining us on this exploration.

Drew Billiau (Production Designer) is a freelance lighting designer based in the Philadelphia area. Recent designs include Larry & Friends and Cycle of My Being Concerts for Opera Philadelphia and The Electric Philadelphia mural in Old City. Drew has designed numerous shows for such companies as Edinburgh Fringe Festival, Jacobs' Pillow, New York Theater Workshop, The Joyce, Vail International Dance Festival, Opera Philadelphia, Vancouver Opera, BalletX, Pennsylvania Ballet, Wilma Theater, Portland Ballet, Lucidity Suitcase, New Paradise Laboratories, Theater Exile and The Lantern Theater. Art installation designs include - The Electric Street, Electric Toronto, Electric Alley, Phoenix Desert Botanical Gardens and the Los Angeles Ice Cream Museum. Drew is currently the Director of Design & Technology at Opera Philadelphia and an Associate Designer with the corporate/industrial lighting firm Fine Design Associates, inc.

Jen Cleary (Cinematographer & Associate Production Manager) is a multidisciplinary artist and producer. Working in established and non-traditional spaces all over the world, she has called Philadelphia her home since 2007. Her work centers the stories of displacement due to gentrification, mental health, and issues facing immigrants entering the United States. She worked with performance artist Kristina Wong for over twelve years, acting as production tour manager and lighting designer for "Wong Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest", "Going Green the Wong Way", and "The Wong Street Journal". Jen has also designed for spoken word artist Ursula Rucker, comedian and actor D'Lo, composer and media artist Pamela Z, and the puppeteers of Sandglass Theatre. Jen is also a two-time Emmy Award-winning broadcast engineer for her work during 9/11 and a Lucie Award-winning photographer whose images are in the permanent collection of the California Heritage Museum. Currently, Jen sits on the boards of Power Street Theatre and Philadelphia Scenic Works.

**Deborah Block (Producing Artistic Director)** has been a consistent figure in the Philadelphian arts community for over 30 years as a director, dramaturg, producer, curator, choreographer and educator. Deborah has been with Theatre Exile since 2006 and assumed the position of Producing Artistic Director in 2013. Prior to that, she was one of the founding organizers of Philadelphia Live Arts Festival and Philly Fringe (now FringeArts) and was program director for ten years. She received her MFA at Temple University where she taught for nine years. Prior to that, she taught at Rowan University, University of the Arts, and was a teaching artist in many K-12 programs. She has received much recognition for her professional and educational work including receiving the Independence Fellowship in the Arts and the Albert Benzwie Award for playwrighting. She is currently on the board of Theatre Philadelphia and has sat on many local and national panels. A sampling of her previous affiliations include Brat Productions, Theatre Ariel, Philadelphia Young Playwrights Festival, The Wilma Theatre and the CEC. She has worked on over 50 professional productions. For Theatre Exile, she has directed Babel, Among the Dead, Sing the Body Electric, Guards at the Taj, Smoke, Red Speedo, Cock, The English Bride, Gruesome Playground Injuries, Iron, Hunter Gatherers, dark play or stories for boys, Roosters and collaborated on Heart & Soles.

Theatre Exile is dedicated to enhancing the cultural experiences of Philadelphians through the staging of works that engage the imagination. Founded in 1996 by Joe Canuso and Trish Kelly, Theatre Exile was created by a group of artists that explore the complexities of the human condition packed with Philadelphian grit and passion. Exile is the first Philadelphia organization to produce such powerhouse playwrights as Tracy Letts, Lucas Hnath, Annie Baker, Rajiv Joseph, Rona Munro, and Hansol Jung among others. In 2016, Exile was named most fearless theatre by Philly Currents and Best Theatre Company by Philadelphia Magazine. Exile received 92 Barrymore nominations, with 19 awards. In 2017, Theatre Exile left their home to begin a new phase in Exile's life. Following her idea to create a new home in their old location in South Philadelphia, Deborah Block with the Board of Directors collaborated with Center City Development and Cecil Baker + Partners, and created a vision for a new theatre that honors the art and maintains Exiles goals of working in an intimate and flexible environment. They produced their first play in the new theatre in February 2019 and moved their office to the new space in April 2019.
